

NICHOLAS AND MARY VITOS

MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

2011 APPLICATION

Mr. Nicholas Vitos is often called a “Great Benefactor” of Saint Nicholas. Indeed, many have benefited from his generosity, not only at St. Nicholas, but throughout the Metropolis of San Francisco.

His bequest included funds not only for this scholarship, but Mr. Vitos also provided for an AHEPA scholarship, a senior home for the Puget Sound region, and a philanthropic fund for the Metropolis of San Francisco. Prior to his death, it was Mr. Vitos’ contributions which helped retire the mortgage of St. Nektarios Greek Orthodox Church, Pasco, Washington.

While his legacy lives on in the philanthropic work established in his name, unfortunately, this man’s remarkable story remains mostly obscure.

Nick Vitos was born in Bura, in the region of Arkadis in Peloponesos, Greece. His family emigrated to the US in his early years, and he attended Tacoma schools; he graduated from Lincoln High School..

Following graduation, Nick attended Knapps Business College, before embarking on a 55-year career in accounting. In his leisure time, Mr. Vitos was active in the Church and Greek community, serving several

terms on the Parish Council and in the Order of AHEPA. Preceded in death by his wife Mary, Mr. Vitos fell asleep in the Lord on April 17, 1991 and was laid to rest alongside his family at Tacoma Cemetery.

From humble beginnings as a young immigrant, Mr. Vitos was aware of the struggles of the unprivileged. To that end, the Nicholas and Mary Vitos Scholarship was established, so that deserving and promising Orthodox young men and women would not want for

training and education for their life’s work. In keeping with Mr. Vitos’ vision and dedication to the church which he loved so much, he stipulated that the scholarship bearing his name would awarded to deserving young people of the St. Nicholas Parish Community who demonstrate dedication to God and His Holy Church, academic excellence, and financial need. The purpose of this application and the Scholarship Committee is to ensure that Mr. Vitos’ will be carried out to the best of our ability.

Mr. Vitos will always be remembers as a man of principle, conviction, and love for Christ’s Church. May his memory and legacy be eternal!

GENERAL DIRECTIONS

1. Recipients and their families must be members in good standing of St. Nicholas, including regular attendance at the worship services, for a period of two years prior to applying for a scholarship.
2. Scholarship recipients shall be chosen from among qualified applicants 24 years old, or younger, who are high school graduates, and who have enrolled, registered, or attended an accredited college, university, or vocational school in pursuit of technical or undergraduate degree. (The Scholarship is not intended for graduate studies.) Scholarships may be renewed, based on continued qualification.
3. The Nicholas and Mary Vitos Memorial Scholarship Committee will accept and review all applications submitted for scholarships.
4. In Selecting the applicants for the purpose of making awards, the Scholarship Committee will apply the following:

FINANCIAL NEED	30 points
ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE <i>Grade point average, honors classes, difficulty or challenge of the academic programs</i>	25 points
ORTHODOX LIFESTYLE <i>Attendance at Divine Services, participation in the Sacramental and social life of the Church</i>	25 points
RECOMMENDATIONS AND REFERENCES	10 points
PERSONAL LETTER: <i>Initial applicant's only. Renewal applicants should have one already on file.</i>	10 points

5. **In order for the application to be considered complete, each applicant must submit the following:**
 - a. Complete application form;
 - b. Official transcripts, sent directly from High School (1st year applicants) or College/University (continuing applicants);
 - c. Letter from the Priest of St. Nicholas Greek Orthodox Church (Continuing applicants who live outside of the area will need to contact our Priest at least quarterly to keep our Priest updated with his/her situation.) ;
 - d. The Student Aid Report (SAR) from the U.S. De-

partment of Education. See page 6 on “**ESTABLISHING FINANCIAL NEED**” for details;

- e. Letters of Recommendation -
 - One high school teacher (1st year applicants) or one college instructor (continuing applicants), preferably from teachers/instructors in the area of concentration/major;
 - One adult (not a family member), such as employer, volunteer supervisor, or other such person in an advisory capacity to the applicant;
- f. Personal Letter (1st year applicant only);
- g. Letter of Acceptance from the vocational/technical school, college, or university.

6. This Application Form and all other materials must be typed or printed (in ink). All requirements must be fulfilled and the application materials postmarked **no later than April 15, 2011 to:**

7. Scholarship recipients shall be notified in writing as to acceptance or rejection, with reason given, in both instances.
8. Scholarship recipients must be present in church on Graduate Recognition Sunday (mid-June) for the Scholarship presentation. Any Scholarship recipient who is absent from the Scholarship Awards Ceremony in church shall make an appropriate explanation, in writing, to the Committee.
9. Scholarship monies shall be sent directly to the college/university business office, to be applied toward the recipient’s account. No money shall be given directly to the recipient.

TO THE APPLICANT:

The duty of the NICHOLAS AND MARY VITOS SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE is to select the most appropriate recipient from among all applications received, using the criteria set forth by Mr. Vitos himself. This is no small task. However, you help us to fulfill Mr. Vitos’ will by presenting a well-prepared and complete application to justify yourself.

We, of the Committee, look forward to reviewing your application, promising to thoughtfully and impartially consider you and your request.
